THE EIGHT SKILLS DEFINED

1) Emotional Intelligence

The ability to sense situations, personalities and dynamics, and respond accordingly, with the knowledge to maximize beneficial impact. 'EI' embodies empathy, compassion, as well as the full spectrum of healthy emotional responses and the foundational desire to understand another's perspective regardless of how different it might be. EI helps cultivate an emotional maturity that exudes respect and can aid success in any circumstance.

2) Communication

The ability to speak clearly to individuals and groups, to inspire positive momentum. AND, the ability to truly *listen* to words and body language such that responses are inclusive, and non-reactive. The ability to impart information that is clear, leaves no ambiguity, promotes positive action, and demonstrates thoughtfulness.

3) Creativity

The ability to call on resources beyond the initially accessible sphere of awareness - to innovate. To stretch beyond one's own assumptions and limitations to engage and utilize new lines of thought and resources, and to operate from a 'resolution-oriented' viewpoint.

4) Impeccability

The desire to operate such that there is a clean trail. To have one's effect and performance reflect an attunement to the environment and to relationships, leaving all situations better than they were before the interaction.

5) Being Synergistic

The ability to support a process with the authentic intention of seeing it succeed regardless of personal agenda. The ability to see and embrace the best role in a situation for its overall success (including in 'followership' or supportive role). A foundational commitment to resolution rather than drama.

6) Honesty

To speak the big truth - and walk the talk - to be transparent about imperfections, learning processes and hidden agendas. To be more concerned with being authentic and transparent, rather than maintaining a false image, or any type of egoically driven identity. To be *real*.

7) Energy

To live in an engaged way. Whether that is viewed as quiet or as more overtly expressive, the sum total is recognizing that the individual is engaged in a dynamic process of being inspired and beneficially impactful...as opposed to apathetic or jaded. *The strength to resist complacency and withholding.*

8) Introspection

Continually reviewing one's impact, motives, desires and action, and holding those to a high standard. To seek ongoing expansion of one's perspectives, skills and lines of development. In short, to have a foundational commitment to personal growth and an openness to continual learning and deeper development.
